#### Giving up?

So often the game of I spy, or trying to guess what someone else wants us to know, ends with us saying, "Oh I give up." We talk about giving up a job or an attempt to achieve something, maybe a diet or an exercise programme. It has negative connotations suggesting that we were too impatient to persevere or lacked the stamina to see the task through to the end. Criticising someone who stops before the end ignores the anguish involved in finally deciding not to finish the task we set ourselves or agreed to take on. I know when I climbed up Ben Nevis, I struggled to make the decision to turn round before I reached the top. I didn't want to give up before getting to the summit, but in the end, with the strength of the winds and the depth of snow underfoot, turning round seemed the wiser option. I'd started to turn back a few times, then tried again, not wanting to be a 'quitter'. Better to walk down under my own steam without reaching the top, than have to be rescued, I decided eventually.

Lent is also often associated with giving up – we decide to give up chocolate or biscuits or something similar as our Lenten discipline. Discipline is another word that can have negative connotations – we associate it with punishment or chastisement. We are disciplined if we step out of line. We talk about strict teachers who exercise firm discipline. It shares the same root as disciple. We are all called to be disciples of Jesus and that involves discipline – keeping on trying even when the going gets tough. I hope Lent won't be too tough for any of us, but what are we going to do as disciples, being disciplined about our life of faith? Will you give something up, or take something up? Maybe aim to read a book that will enrich your faith, or a book of the Bible you've never got around to; try a different way of praying, or go to a Lent group or the One Voice Lent Lunches (see the dates and places below). Christian Aid produce a calendar to help you count your blessings (available to order, or use online <a href="https://www.christianaid.org.uk/lent-easter-appeal/count-your-blessings-online">https://www.christianaid.org.uk/lent-easter-appeal/count-your-blessings-online</a>). There is also one produced by Action for Children – please ask if you want more information.

Whatever you choose to give up, or take up, or continue doing, may Lent be a time of growth for you this year. **Helen**

#### IN FEBRUARY OUR CHURCH GAVE A TOTAL OF 70Kg OF FOOD AND TOILETRIES TO THE HUNSLET DISTRIBUTION CENTRE.

A few details from the Food Bank February Newsletter;- From 1<sup>st</sup> to 29<sup>th</sup> January 2020 - Leeds South & East Food Banks **FED A TOTAL OF 398 PEOPLE**, 220 adults and 178 children. Various reasons caused these folk to need help from the Food Bank – benefit delays and changes accounted for 157, debt 38, low income 180, sickness 5, homelessness 5 and other reasons 13.

A box for your contributions of food/toiletries is in the Galilee. Wanted especially this month is Coffee, Tinned Potatoes, Tinned Fish, Long Life Milk, Squash, Juice.

Two new Food Banks are to open in our area – St Wilfred's (Halton) will open on Wednesday mornings and Neruka's Soup Kitchen (Gledhow Road) will open on Fridays 11am to 1pm Thank you for your continued support.
