

Cross Gates Methodist Church - World War One Memorial

Here is the final part of my article about the men named on the plaque in church. Thank you to David Teal who provided a lot of the information about these people. **Christine Holdstock**

Sergeant John Peacock

John was born in Saltburn, Yorkshire but his address from 1914 to 1918 on the electoral register was 25 Marshall Street, Crossgates. He enlisted into the Royal Engineers in Leeds and was later transferred to the Royal Tank Corps. He was killed in action on 9th Aug 1918 in the Somme region of France. His pension was paid to his mother Isabelle Peacock. He is listed in a book of the "Leeds Roll of Honour".



Second Lieutenant Eric Arthur Stephenson



Lt. E. A. Stephenson,

Eric was born in 1896 in Pocklington, Yorkshire. His father, Arthur, was stationmaster at Cross Gates in 1918.

Eric had enlisted in the Northumberland Fusiliers, but on 29th August 1917 was commissioned into the Yorkshire Regiment as temporary 2nd Lieutenant and attached to the 2nd Battalion West Yorkshire Regiment Eric Stephenson was part of the North Russia Expeditionary Force, which left the UK in October 1918, to support the White Russians. From the Yorkshire Regiment he was then attached to the 17th Battalion of the King's Liverpool Regiment. On 7th February 1919, Eric Stephenson's Company attacked the Bolshevik forces. They quickly took the nearby small town of Kodish but enemy resistance was so strong that the attack had to be called off. When the Allies returned to their previous positions it was found that Eric had been wounded and failed to join them at base.



He was never seen again and presumably either died of his wounds or was killed by the enemy. He is commemorated at the Archangel Allied Memorial and on a family gravestone in Pocklington cemetery.
