Remembering Anne Martin

Anne Martin died at the beginning of January, less than two weeks after her husband Bill. Anne was an integral member of our Church for more than sixty years but was one of those people who hated the limelight and was much happier washing up than taking centre stage.

Beryl Gledhill described her as a 'special person, full of love for others'.

Myra Rowlands said 'Anne was a very caring neighbour and I shall never forget her helping me when I had returned home from hospital after an operation. She always had a smile and would call regularly to see if I needed anything. She frequently picked up medication for me and sometimes odd items of shopping as I was housebound for a while. I was very saddened to hear of her loss and Anne will be remembered fondly for her great kindness. R.I.P. Anne'.

Tracy Dick recounted that Anne helped her in so many ways when her daughter was young and her parents became ill. Anne would babysit, occasionally take Jessica to school and looked after a young member of the family so everyone could attend the funerals. Anne's response when given flowers for being so supportive was 'I do this for love, not flowers'.

Cynthia Best said 'Anne was a great Pastoral visitor for many years. She was also one of a team of ladies always on hand to do Harvest teas and funeral teas for Church members'.

A joint funeral for Anne and Bill will be held at Lawnswood at the beginning of February. Details have not yet been confirmed. Helen will be conducting the service so please contact her in a couple of weeks for further information.

Spotlight on.....Brenda Dean

As far back as I can remember, I attended Salem Sunday School near Leeds Bridge. We lived in Hunslet in the 'back to backs'. My sister, who was 11 years older than I, took me as she helped with the Sunday School. My brother was 13 years older than I and he helped with the scouts, until he was called up into the army. He was in the D day landings at the age of 18, like many others would have been. He survived the landings, but was shot, and he was air lifted back to hospital in Birmingham. When he recovered he was sent back to the army, but this time, to the war in North Africa. Fortunately he survived the war.

Our family moved house in 1949 as the 'back to backs' were being cleared for modern development. We moved into a modern flat development in the Holbeck district of Leeds. I became friends with a girl who lived in the same block of flats and as we grew older, she started going out with a boyfriend. Eventually I was introduced to one of his friends who was serving in the army and was home on a weekend pass. This was Brian, my future husband to be. Brian lived in Beeston and he helped with the scouts at the Church he attended. This was St Mary's C of E across the road from where he lived. We were married there in 1958. We were soon in the process of buying a 'back to back' house in the Holbeck area.

I was employed in the tailoring trade as a machinist and I had worked for many companies. When I got married I carried on working for a number of years at the Co-op Mantle factory on a part-time basis. This was on the Mint just the other side of Holbeck Moor. Brian worked in the Metallurgy office of the Yorkshire Copper Works in Hunslet. Whilst working there he privately took a correspondence course in accountancy and an opportunity arose for him at the Lloyds Bank which he applied for and was successful in securing the position.

We moved to Cross Gates in 1962 as we had wanted a better house with a garden before we had any family. Barbara was born in March of that year and Colin was born three years later. Stephen was born in 1972. We began attending Cross Gates Church around 1970/71. It was our neighbours, Tom and Joyce Nowland who had told us about this Church that they had just got a new Minister Rev. Ken Taylor. They were very enthusiastic about it so we thought we would start attending. We were very comfortable there and everyone was so friendly.

Once we had got established, I became a Sunday School Teacher in the Primary department. A few months later I was asked if I would move to Upper Juniors, which I did. Back then the Junior Department was so large

that they had to split it into two units. I am sure many of you will remember.

Brian has also got himself involved with the Church, by helping out with the scouts when it was Scout Camp. I remember going with them and taking Stephen with us. It was great fun and Colin who was a scout, was also with us. Brian was also the Property Treasurer and looked after the heating which was then fuelled by oil. Many was the time Barbara and Colin were roped in to help, as every time there was a delivery of oil, the tank overflowed. They had to go into the cellar and clear it up. The heating then was turned on/off manually and valves on pipes in the Church had to be opened and closed on Sat/Sun. Brian had to go down early on Sunday morning to make sure the heating had come on! He did that for 30 years. Brian had to stop seeing to the heating due to serious illness and the heating had been changed to a computerised system. It certainly made life easier (no more oil to clean up).

Many people knew of Brian's love of walking in the Yorkshire Dales. He was asked if he would lead a walk for the Church people who enjoyed such outings which he did. Out of this came the Cross Gates Rambling Club. I was involved with the Ladies Friendship Group for many years including being President and Secretary for six years. During this time Barbara had become a guide and gained her Queens Guide Award. She had also become a Venture Scout, once girls were allowed – this was due to the efforts of David Leeming. Barbara also became a Lay Preacher before the university took her away.

Dorothy and Keith Walker knew us when we came to Church as Dorothy's father and her brother played the organ at the Salem Congregational Church, so they knew the Salem people quite well. They took me to the last service there. Sadly I lost Brian on 4th January 2009 but in conclusion I have spent (with Brian) 50 happy, memorable years at Cross Gates Methodist Church in which I have made some very good friends.
