Spring Cleaning

It's time for a bit of spring cleaning, or perhaps I should say, having a belated catch up on the cleaning that needs doing!! It's not my favourite pastime, but I prefer to live in a reasonably clean and tidy place, so it has to be done. The dust and dirt will be (very) temporarily banished, and the bath and sink will gleam; the rugs will be washed and the air will smell clean and fresh. The house will almost be ready for the sun to shine, and show me the corners that I missed, and the smears still on the windows.... Or perhaps it can wait a bit longer, after all, my friend and her dog will be visiting again, and the plumber is coming to fit a new toilet and hand basin – and that will make dust...

Of course, with the way my mind works, I started thinking about how this fitted with Lent. It can be seen as a season for an internal spring clean. But just as it's not much good if I only clean the house in spring, so it's no good only having an internal clean up in Lent – there's dusting and cleaning to be done all year round. Sin creeps back in, just as the dust and dirt are back in my house almost before the hoover has had time to cool down. It can be good to have an annual clean when we're perhaps a bit more thorough (or is it only me who doesn't move the furniture most of the time?). The same applies to our lives – we need the times of reflection and tidying up as well as the times of celebration. And just like me and cleaning my house, we can easily find good reasons to delay our clear out. Is it worth doing when it's only going to get dirty again? Is it worth clearing out the sin when we know we'll only mess up again?

Lent was initially a time of preparation for those who were to be baptised, or welcomed back into the church, at Easter. It was a time for prayer, and learning, and growth in faith, and yes, a time for a spiritual spring clean. It is still a time for us to reflect on our journey of faith. How is my relationship with God? Are there dark corners that need dusting out, sin that needs to be confessed, anything that needs to be changed? Am I ready for the bright light of Easter? As we journey through Lent, and March, the dawn chorus will grow, as more birds join in to welcome the spring mornings. Following our Lenten spring clean, will we be ready to join in the Easter chorus, welcoming the dawn of new life: 'Alleluia! Christ is risen!'

May you journey with Jesus through Lent, paying attention to your relationship with God, that together we can welcome the risen Christ next month. *Helen*

Equal Marriage Discussion Tuesday March 22nd, 7.30pm, Church Hall

There have been on-going discussions about marriage and relationships over recent years. Last July, the Methodist Conference, reached a decision that within the Methodist Church two equally valid views are held. Some are convinced that marriage can only be between one man and one woman; others that marriage can be between any two adults. We live with these contradictory convictions. As a result of the Conference decision, each local Church Council is asked to decide whether or not to register their building for same sex weddings. On Tuesday 22nd March at 7.30pm there will be an open meeting at Cross Gates, in the Hall, so that we can talk and listen to one another's views on this. If the conversations suggest we are ready to do so, the Church Council members will then vote on whether or not to register Cross Gates Methodist Church for same sex weddings. Only Church Council members may vote, but everyone is welcome to be part of the conversations.

Leeds South & East Foodbank helping local people in crisis

In January our Church plus Tranquility Court delivered 12 baskets of food / toiletries to the Distribution Centre, weighing 150KG plus cash of £40. Everything was gratefully received. If you would like to contribute food/toiletries there is a basket in the Galilee or contact John Best on email jvbest39@hotmail.com - who will gladly arrange to collect. In the Financial year between 1st April 2020 and 31st March 2021, food banks in the Trussell Trust's UK wide network distributed 2.5 million emergency food parcels to people in crisis, a 33% increase on the previous year - 980,000 of these went to children.

"No one should face the indignity of needing emergency food. Yet our network of Food Banks has given out record numbers of food parcels as more and more people struggle for the essentials. This is not right but we know we can build a better future. Spotlight on..... June Holliday

Thank you friends for allowing me to tell you a little bit about myself. I was born on the 30th July 1950 in Nevile Walk, Osmondthorpe. I went to Osmondthorpe school till I was 7 then went to Parklands till I was 11, then I went to Coldcotes secondary modern where I finished my education. I had 4 brothers Alan, Ronnie, Colin and Lawrence who have all have passed away now. My last brother, my youngest passed away in December 2018. My Mum Gladys was only partially sighted and my Dad Willie was totally blind and never saw any of us.

My Mum was my Dad's eyes and I was my Mum's eyes. I attended St Philip's Osmondthorpe where I was christened and confirmed then I started going to St Wilfrid's where I was a parishioner for 41 years and became a born again Christian. I loved it there and had made many friends. We were like a family all brothers and sisters in Christ. When I left school at 14 I went into tailoring which was my Dad's choice not mine. I wanted to be a dental receptionist or a nurse. I started work at Montague Burton on Hudson Road and was there 7 years. I had a lot of happy times there then I left there and went to Hepworths on Clay Pit Lane.

I had no social life until 2018 (more on that further on).

My Mum passed away in December 1977 and that's when my social life was put on the back burner where it simmered till 2018.

After my Mum died, I gave up working to become my Dad's full time carer because the onus was on me with me been the only girl - well boys will be boys and my brothers all wanted to have fun and left it all to me.

Lawrence who was known as the black sheep of the family clung to me because none of my other brothers asked him to join in with them. My other brothers went everywhere together they stuck together like glue. Then when my Dad passed away in 1992 I became a full time carer to Lawrence who suffered health problems although he was quite healthy when he was younger. We lived together in the same house; a 3 bedroom in Wykebeck Place for 30 years but I never had a life I could call my own.

I didn't go out and I was what they call a loner. It was like that for the 30 years.

Lawrence's last 6 years were the worst for him and me. He was diagnosed with COPD and over the years he deteriorated and spent more time in casualty. I had to accompany him and I missed going to Church because I kept having sleepless nights. I was always happy when

I went to Church and it kept me going through the hard times. The Church has always been my rock since I started going.

After Lawrence died in 2018, I was at a complete loss I didn't know what to do. I had no friends and no social life but it didn't really bother me as I had had a quiet life and I was happy in my own sweet way. I never once got depressed and I kept thinking positively every day. I never reached out to anyone after Lawrence passed away. My positivity and God's spirit in me gave me the strength to carry on.

Then one day after Lawrence died I was sitting in my chair and was looking out of my window and I realised there was a world outside the 4 walls and I just had to pluck up courage to get outside into the world. I felt like I had been a tortoise all my life and it was time to come out of my shell. It was pure joy when it happened and it felt like a bud that had burst open and I've been flourishing ever since. I clenched my fist and cried tears of joy and said 'I'm free'. I cried for nearly 2 hours - I couldn't help it but they were tears of joy.

I then joined Cross Gates Good Neighbours and that's when a new world opened up for me and my social life went from zero to where I am now. I am always out and about with something to do every day, new challenges awaiting and new goals. I have met loads of new friends there and am making more each day. I feel really blessed.

But my blessings didn't end there - God blessed me with a new home here in Tranquility Court in the very heart of Cross Gates. I couldn't ask for a better place to live and I feel God has moved me here to do His will. God has loved me so much and my heart is overflowing. I've enough love in me to fill an ocean and I know there are a lot of folk out there that don't know Love and I just want to share it with them and with my new family at Cross Gates Methodist Church where I am now. I was made a member just a couple of months back. Cross Gates Methodist Church comes out top for friendliness and welcome and I LOVE YOU ALL

Thank you all for allowing me to tell you a bit about myself and as I come to get to know more of you over time and get to know your names I'll hold you all in my heart and pray for each one of you that you too will live and grow and move in the power of the spirit
