There is Room...

How many nativity plays have you seen, where a small child stands there, arms folded, declaring, 'There's no room, you can't come in!' It's a part of the Christmas story we're all familiar with - no room at the inn for Mary and Joseph and the soon to arrive baby. This Advent and Christmas we're focussing on who and what there is room for. There is room for you and me; for difference; for all of nature; for all ages and genders. There is room for people experiencing poverty, for God, for refugees and for revelation. In the Christmas story all those groups are represented. We see people who are different, like the magi. They were not part of the chosen people of Israel, yet there was room for them. Sheep, camels, donkeys, mice I guess all found room in the stable. Mary - young and female - found room at the centre of the story, in a world where older age and being male was important. The shepherds found room - in fact were invited in first, despite their poverty (or because of it?). There was room for God - even if it was amongst the animals rather than with the people in the house. At least it would have been warm. There was room in the story for refugees - Mary, Joseph and Jesus found themselves refugees from Herod - but that means refugees are part of the story. And there is room for revelation. All those involved in the events of the first Christmas, and what followed, discovered something of God. God's nature was revealed in how everything happened; in the very fact that God came to live amongst people, as one of us.

There is room for so much in the Christmas story. There is room for so many, including you and me, whoever you are. How will you make room

for God this Advent and Christmas? How will you make room for everyone else - those who are like us and those who are not; those who are poor and those who are rich; those who are refugees and those who have settled, safe places to live? God's welcome is infinitely large. God's story has space for everyone. Come and take your place in God's story and discover there is room for you, as well as me.

Charitable Donations

Many thanks to everyone who gave so generously to DEC's **Pakistan Floods Appeal**. £446.26 was raised including £80.00 in Gift Aid. In their acknowledgement letter DEC say that thanks to your generosity they have been able to provide life-saving aid to people in Pakistan, helping

them to provide emergency aid such as clean water, food, emergency shelter and health assistance.

Cross Gates & District Good Neighbours' Scheme thanked us for our £100 donation. This year they will use the funds towards their Christmas party. This way the donation will reach and support as many people as possible and give everybody something to look forward to.

Church Finances

Many of you will be aware that we are trying to find ways of cutting costs and making savings due to the impact the COVID pandemic has had on the Church's financial situation. There are two areas that have been identified so far.

If you are currently using offertory envelopes you will by now have received a letter from Amanda Brow, Stewardship Recorder, outlining the option to change your regular giving from weekly to monthly. This would reduce the number of envelopes we need to order per person from 52 to 12, which will not only save money but will also help save the environment by reducing wastage of envelopes.

Every year we make budgeted payments to various charities both locally and within The Methodist Church. For many years the amounts of these donations have remained the same and it was only during the first few months of the pandemic that we realised a review was needed as our income fell. We have continued to review the budgeted payments each September at the Finance & Property meeting with any changes being approved by the Church Council.

The recent review resulted in further reductions and even suspension of some donations. The Church Council agreed that our focus should be on more local charities such as Crossgates Good Neighbours, Seacroft Friends & Neighbours, Meeting Point and St George's Crypt. Donations to Christian Aid, the Bible society and Caring for Life have been suspended for now. We will still raise funds at Christmas for St Gemma's Hospice and Action for Children but will not be giving additional donations this year. The hardest decision was to reduce our donations to World Missions, Mission in Britain and Methodist Women in Britain. We have always generously supported these organisations in the past but at the moment it is just not possible. The budgeted payments will continue to be reviewed annually by the Finance & Property Committee and Church Council.

Our income has steadily reduced over the last $2 \frac{1}{2}$ years and we are now using our Reserves to make sure our assessment can be met each quarter. The savings we have identified so far will not solve our financial situation but will help reduce some of our costs.

I am grateful for your continued financial support of our Church. If you have any questions please do not hesitate to have a word with me.
