## Walking on a Lifepath

As I write this article, I'm looking forward to a week working with primary school aged children, teaching them about the Christian faith, and Methodist tradition, by exploring the life of John Wesley with them. The Wesley Lifepath is a project I've been part of writing for the last few years, and a true joy, if a slightly exhausting one sometimes! Groups of children come and spend the whole day with us in church (this time, working with a neighbouring circuit, we're excited to be seeing 8 schools through the doors), and they learn a bit about John Wesley's life, and much more about the influence that his life and legacy have had on those of us who are Methodists, and indeed the wider world too. Of course, all of this is done with interactive workshops which include plenty of mess and fun, and a good sprinkling of action songs too... We follow a format through the event that enable us to explore John Wesley's *Lifepath* and helps us to think about our own paths through life, encouraging young people to reflect on how we are all able to make a difference in the world, and work with others to seek justice. It's a project I love, and I feel I could fill several volumes on the various reflections I have about it, but for today, I want to offer just a thought or two about the concept of the 'Lifepath'.

John Wesley's *Lifepath* is one which gives lots of rich resources for children to reflect on, as a person who was inspired to act in certain ways and achieve some extraordinary things as a result of this faith. Each of us are also on a *Lifepath*, and though most of us are unlikely to leave a legacy as impactful as John Wesley's, we can choose to act in certain ways and achieve wonderful things as a result of our faith. Who knows what differences we might make to others as we go along the path.

As we approach the season of remembrance, I wonder if there are other *lifepaths* that we have been touched by? The life of a family member or close friend who has inspired us in faith? The life of a teacher or colleague who taught us lifechanging lessons? The life of a medical professional whose commitment to their vocation meant we received essential care?

I suppose the point for me is that none of us are walking along our lifepaths in isolation from others, and our paths through life are not forged without the impact of those who have gone before.

It's good to take time to be grateful for those who have paved the path for us as we journey in faith, and to consider carefully how our lifepaths might be impacting others.

Above all, perhaps we can remember that the path we take has been walked before us by Jesus, and it is a way illuminated by the light of the divine, who calls us to be creative, compassionate, justice-seeking and world-changing people, as individuals and as a collective body. How we seek to be and do these things, well, that's been left to us. I pray we take time to pray and meditate on the way we are each called to walk the *lifepath* ahead, seeking to step in the Saviour's imprints as we go.

Regiment (Prince of Wales's
Own) - the Leeds Pals, died on
01 July 1916, age 25. He is
remembered on the Thiepval
Memorial to the missing on the
Somme. In 1911 he was living
with his parents, Jane and

Whitkirk, (off Hollyshaw Lane)

# Private **EDMUND STEPHENSON CLOUGH**

## Rifleman ERIC SUTHERLAND MACKAY

8th Bn., West Yorkshire Regiment (Prince of Wales's Own), died on 31 July 1918, age 18, son of Robert and Eleanor Mackay, of 26, Hollyshaw Lane, Whitkirk, Leeds. He is remembered at the St. Sever Cemetery Extension, Rouen. Also on Whitkirk memorial.



# Private **THOMAS ANTHONY SOWREY**

37th Gen. Hosp, Royal Army Medical Corps, died on 12 March 1917, age 27.

In 1911 he was living with his parents Joshua and Mary Hannah at The Arcade Crossgates. He is remembered at the Mikra British Cemetery, Kalamaria. in the city of Thessaloniki, Greece.
