From our Senior Steward, Barbara Lloyd

I want to keep you informed about what is happening in our Church.

We all understand how difficult it must be for our Minister to fit in chairing all the meetings they are obliged to attend when they have responsibility for five Churches.

Because of this we have to try and find ways of changing our ways of working so that each Church has an 'equal share' of the Minister's time and all the formally required meetings take place.

One of the ways we have changed our practice is that the Stewards of all Rev. Becki's Churches meet together several times a year at one of her Churches; we each give a brief update about things that have happened in our individual Churches, what has been good or not so good, any concerns we have, or things we want to discuss after lunch. Yes.... We have a faith lunch! This joint meeting saves the Minister several separate meetings, plus from our point of view it is good for us to hear what is happening at other Churches and eat together.

After lunch, we each have a blank preaching plan for the coming quarter, and we go through it week by week to make sure:

- Each Church celebrates Communion once a month
- The Minister attends (if possible) individual Church's Special services, eg Memorial Service, Ash Wednesday
- We may suggest another Minister or Local Preacher who we would like to take a service if the Minister cannot take it

For special services like Christmas and Easter we all have to take it in turns to have our Minister to lead it <u>OR</u> decide whether we will change the time of the service <u>OR</u> join with another Church. None of these are ideal as none of us like change, but it will never go back to having one Minister for every one or two Churches.

Your feedback is very welcome about services, what you like and what you don't. But we all need to accept that we can no longer expect our Minister to take all the services we would like at the time we would like.

In the near future we plan to join with other Churches for some other meetings, a joint property meeting has already taken place and a meeting of secretaries. Joint Church Councils need more consideration.

Gaza Justice Campaign

Extracts from a joint update from All We Can and the Methodist Church in Britain

As justice seekers we can't stay silent!

We cannot stay silent in the face of atrocities that continue to be perpetrated in Gaza. We have a duty to stand in solidarity with our partners on the ground who are bravely continuing their life-transforming work in the face of 'mass forced hunger, mass forced displacement, mass killings and mass atrocities.'

In November, All We Can, the Methodist Church in Britain and the United Reform Church launched the joint 'Gaza and Lebanon Justice appeal' to raise awareness of the unfolding disaster, and to meet the humanitarian need resulting from the worsening crisis in Gaza and Lebanon. But to give financial support alone is not sufficient.

We will act and call for justice.

We believe that all are made in the image of God, each worthy of equal value and dignity. God wills the flourishing of creation and human community within it. We believe, that in solidarity with others, we are called to challenge injustice that contradicts God's plan for a just world. We have a duty to use our voices and power to challenge what is unjust. The UK government, along with France and Canada in a joint statement has called on Isreal to halt military operations and allow humanitarian aid to enter the territory. It says that 'We will not stand by while the Netanyahu government pursues these egregious actions. If Isreal does not cease the renewed military offensive and lift its restrictions on humanitarian aid, we will take further concrete actions in response'. However, despite the suspension of some arms export licenses to Isreal in September last year, the UK still supplies components that are used in combat aircraft operations in Gaza, and we are concerned that these concrete actions are an empty threat which will not alleviate the suffering of the Palestinian people.

Therefore, we call on the UK Government to act with decency and morality, and to urgently implement these threatened actions. We encourage people to **write to their MPs** to echo this call. We also ask that people continue to support our partners by **donating to our appeal** and find out more about their work. We offer this prayer for the decision-makers, may they be guided by what is right and have the courage to act. We commit to working towards a just and lasting peace, and the recognition of the state of Palestine alongside the state of Isreal.

Please remember in your thoughts and prayers: All those people in our prayer book and those we know who are unwell, in hospital, in Nursing Homes, going for tests at Hospital, recently bereaved and who find this time of year particularly difficult.
