Worship changes at Colton during April

Palm Sunday 13th April: On Sunday 13th April we will be meeting at 12 noon rather than the usual 10.30am. Good Friday 18th April: We will meet at Colton at 10am to join the Churches Together in East Leeds Walk of Witness, to Cross Gates Methodist Church, for the reading of the Passion at 11am.

Easter Day Sunday 20th April: All Age worship will be at 9.30am at Colton, led by Revd Becki Stennett including Holy Communion, as we celebrate Easter Day.

Sunday 27th April: We will meet for worship at Colton at 10.30am as normal, along with Junior Church. But rather than having a preacher, we will be joining worship that is taking place at Cross Gates Methodist via Zoom, so please bear with us and our technology! We are testing this for future services where we may need to share preachers. You are warmly invited to worship at Cross Gates in person if you prefer.

Colton Eco-Church Update Earth Day 2025: Tuesday 22nd April

Earth Day is marked on the 22nd April each year. It aims to highlight the importance of protecting the environment and became a global event in 1990 – though the first Earth Day took place in 1970 in the US in response to a spill from an oil tanker. This year it's expected that over one billion people of all ages in almost 200 countries will take part in activities to mark Earth Day, according to the organisers.

For our young people, or any teachers amongst us, the BBC is hosting a 'Live Lesson' on Earth Day, providing activity sheets, videos and an assembly plan for primary age children - search the BBC website for Teach, Earth Day. The 'Live Lesson' will start at 11am on CBBC.

The theme of the global Earth Day this year is 'Our Power, Our Planet' and it's encouraging us to consider how we can all take action to unite behind renewable energy. The senior stewards (Kathryn and Elaine) advised the meeting that a review of the role of steward is being carried out with the view to creating the role of Sunday Steward. This role would concentrate on the arrangements for Sunday worship, without additional governance duties. Jenny and Dorothy expressed an interest in taking on this role once the review has been completed.

• **Representatives to Church Council:** thanks were expressed to Jane for her time served in this role as she is now stepping down. Maureen offered to serve as a representative from the AGM and the meeting welcomed this offer!


