Edward's Letter

Greetings in the precious name of Jesus Christ the pioneer and perfecter of our faith. I'm writing just a hours after the breaking news of the rescue of 41 workers who were trapped in a collapsed tunnel in the

District of Uttarakhand in India and remarkably rescued.

Families, friends and colleagues were restless, sleepless, praying and waiting for news that they have been rescued. Numerous professionals including tunnel experts Arnold Dix and Chris Cooper were involved in the rescue efforts. After 17 days the workers emerged from the tunnel amid jubilation.

The ancient Israelites were waiting too, for liberating news. During the reign of King Ahaz the Lord had promised through the words of the prophet Isaiah, "The virgin will conceive and give birth to a son, and will call him Immanuel" (Isaiah 7: 14). Hundreds of years later they were still waiting for that event which would liberate them to happen, - the birth of the Messiah.

I don't know what your current situation is as you read this, but most of us spend some part of our lives waiting for liberating news, for a time when something will change. It may be release from ill health, finishing off the mortgage, etc. It is so easy wishing our lives away, waiting for the news that we hope will liberate us from some aspect of our current lives.

The best news and the most liberating as we approach another Christmas, was brought over 700 years after the promise to King Ahaz when the angel visited Mary to announce the fulfilment of that liberating news in the birth of Jesus. Jesus himself confirmed that in the first recorded words of his adult life, in Mark 1:15, "The time has come. The Kingdom of God is near. Repent and believe in the good news." Later, the apostle Paul emphasised it when writing to the church in Corinth, "I tell you now is the time of God's favour, now is the day of salvation" (2 Corinthians 6:2).

What are we waiting for? No change in our life can bring greater liberation than to spend today trusting in Jesus Christ. As we celebrate another Christmas, let's not wish our lives away for something that may or may not happen, and may or may not change our lives. Rather let's celebrate by following Jesus today. Also, as we say goodbye to 2023 and welcome 2024, may we look forward with great expectation, no matter in what circumstances we presently are.

When the aerials are down, and your spirit is covered with snow of cynicism and the ice of pessimism, then you are grown old, even at twenty, but as long as your aerials are up, to catch the waves of optimism, there is hope you may die young even at 100."

A Carpenter's Legacy

Taken from "Musings Of A Wayward Pilgrim" by Mark Zenick; printed here with the author's kind permission.

The centuries have seen theologians, church officials and laymen debate and debunk the notion that the carpenter, Jesus of Nazareth, was the perfect embodiment of the divine in human form. "Perfect" meaning the absence of all sin, immune to the frailties and foibles which mark us all as members of a broken human race. These dogmatic arguments, often heated and contentious, seem to me to miss the essential point of Jesus's place in the unfolding of human history. For if nothing else this Jesus for more than three decades lived as a man of sinew and flesh in a dusty land exhorting his brothers and sisters to discover new life beyond the temptations of anger, selfishness and despair. Even if only a small portion of the stories of his life on earth were poignantly true, then Jesus clearly called, and is calling, all of us to be larger and better than we can imagine ourselves becoming, through the compelling example of his own days on this earth. Whether as a human being Jesus was, or was not, perfect may be beside the point. This charismatic carpenter moved among us to tell, show and impress upon us the truth that divinity rests however dormant within each and every one of us.
