Financial Update from The Treasurer

As you are all aware, attendance at Church has fallen over the last 5 years and consequently the income from our weekly offerings, which is used to pay our assessment to the Circuit. Our Reserves have steadily reduced, and we have now reached a point where we no longer have sufficient funds available to meet our assessment for this Church year. Linda Booth, the Property Treasurer, offered to help out paying the assessment from property funds, however a larger than expected bill to repair the Church roof over the summer means these funds are no longer available.

On December 1st there will be an extraordinary meeting of the Church Council to discuss the current financial situation. The Superintendent of the Circuit & the Circuit Treasurer will be at the meeting to give us advice and guidance. Goodbye to ELHAS

The East Leeds History and Archaeology Society (ELHAS) will hold its final meeting on 28th November 2025 in the Methodist Church Hall, Austhorpe Road. The society began in January of 1998 originally based in Cross Gates Library. Within a short time however monthly meetings were moved to the Methodist Church Hall, thus beginning a long relationship which lasted over 25 years.

Having established the East Leeds Heritage Centre in the library, this room was used to run local and family history courses, host school visits and provide an information point for people with local history queries. It also housed exhibitions featuring local interest subjects and stored the society's archives and library.

Over the years the Society played its part in the community by holding open days and running stalls in both the library and the shopping centre using these as opportunities to sell their publications such as The Leeds History Journal and various one off booklets like Smeaton of Austhorpe. Perhaps the proudest achievement of the society has been the promotion of the "Barnbow Lasses" story – making the whole city aware of the contribution these munitions workers made to the war effort in World War One and documenting the tragedy which occurred there in 1916. The Society's efforts in this area have resulted in two memorials, a play and roads in a local housing development named after the victims of the accident.

It has been a privilege and a pleasure to be involved in the Society for so many years, but sadly the time has come to step back. We are grateful for the opportunities which it has afforded us and thankful to have made so many friends, friendships which we hope will endure.
