So, this Lent, I invite us to recognise and acknowledge where we see newness in our churches, communities and world. And let us not be afraid to name it, share it and thank God for it.



Plans for Future Church Services @ Colton

The last draft of the quarterly plan identified issues which will arise from September 2025 when there is one less presbyter in the circuit. This puts more pressure on Lay Preachers and supernumerary ministers who have been asked to try and fill in the many gaps.

Becki has been forward thinking on this issue and encouraged several meetings between church stewards, which we have attended, to consider different ways of worship including joint services or services at different times. The stewards at Colton have elected within this quarter and likely the next to do a local arrangement.

We realise that joint or different service arrangements are not 'everyone's cup of tea' but ask that you will work with us and 'give them a try'. All services will be respectful and held with reverence. All of the churches within the circuit are in the same situation. Colton have been working with the other churches to put together a plan which we hope you will embrace, and these are some of the upcoming changes to our usual worship routine:

30th March 10.30am - Joint service @ Cross Gates with Garforth, Christ Church, Scholes and Colton to celebrate Becki's return from Sabbatical. See the "Mothering Sunday" article elsewhere in this edition of Contact. (No worship at Colton).

13th April 12noon Palm Sunday - a Susannah's Table type service, including lunch (provided), followed by either a Prayer Walk, which we hope all ages will join, or a "Wednesday JAM" style session held in church, both with distribution of Palm Crosses.

27th April 10.30am - a service at Cross Gates which will be joined via Zoom from within Colton Church, or if you wish you can attend in person at Cross Gates. During the following quarter, we at Colton will no doubt be hosting joint services for the other churches to attend. Junior Church will continue to meet when it's not all age worship.

As stewards we are doing our best to engage with other churches whilst ensuring that Colton Church remains at the heart of the Colton Community.

Here are a few small things that you could do which will all add up to
making a big difference, getting us closer to our RACE finish line!
☐ Only boil the water you need when making your cuppa
☐ Don't leave electrical devices on standby – turn them off at the wall
□ When you leave a room with no one else in it, turn the lights off
□ Dress in layers to keep yourself warm, not the space around you
□ Instead of running the tap to get the water cold, keep a jug of water
in the fridge to keep it colder for longer
 Run your washing machine or dishwasher on the lowest temperature
settings
□ Go peat free in the garden
□ Take a reusable water bottle or mug for hot drinks with you – some
coffee shops even give you a discount when you use your own mug!

Though you may be doing some of these things already, what's the extra small thing you can do this week to help look after the earth God gave us? - Colton Eco Church Team.
