Continuity and Change

I've got wind on my mind. That is partly because I was thinking about what I was going to write whilst out walking the dog just now - and it is very windy. As you are reading this at the end of April/beginning of May, just think back to what the weather was like during Easter week... This morning I saw footage of a lorry being blown over on the M62, and planes struggling to land at Heathrow.

But wind is also on my mind in relation to May. What a month we have ahead of us. For a start, three of the Mondays are Bank Holidays - so no Tots and Guests or Coffee Morning in three of the weeks. A nice break for the volunteers, but probably a bit of a gap for some of those who come along. The month is topped and tailed with celebrations. The first weekend has the King's Coronation - for many of us the first coronation we'll witness, and for even more of us, the first in our adult lives. I wonder what memories will be made. The stories I've heard from the Queen's Coronation in 1953 are of lots of people gathering round very small televisions in those houses that were fortunate enough to have one. This time, very few people won't have access to a television, computer, tablet, or some other means of viewing if they want to. Just think what winds of change have blown through our world in the last 70 years. I wonder what those winds of change will bring in the next few years. Yet alongside that, in the Coronation service we will witness centuries of tradition. Think of the symbols of orb and sceptre; the anointing which links to the anointing of Biblical kings; Edward the Confessor's chair. Winds of change, and yet some things stay the same.

There is continuity to be seen in great ceremonies like the Coronation, as there was in the late Queen's state funeral.

And at the end of the month, the church celebrates Pentecost. Just think of the winds of change that blew in Jerusalem on that day. Winds that changed Peter, the 'foot-in-mouth' fisherman, into an articulate preacher. Winds that changed shy, fearful disciples into apostles who shared all that they had learnt of Jesus. But even that day continued what had been known in the past. The prophet Joel wrote: 'I will pour out my spirit on all flesh; your sons and your daughters shall prophesy, your old men shall dream dreams, and your young men shall see visions.' (Joel 2:28) Elsewhere in the Old Testament fire and wind have been signs of God at work. So too at Pentecost.

Whatever May brings for you, whatever winds of change are blowing in your lives, I pray that you will know the continuity of God's presence with you. **Helen**

Leeds South & East Foodbank

In March our Church delivered 186KG of food to the Leeds South and East distribution centre.

'Leeds South and East Food Bank is part of the Trussell Trust Foodbank Network. We are one of over 400 Foodbanks providing emergency food to people in crisis nationwide. We give food to people in a state of crisis in the Leeds South East area of the City. People access one of the Foodbank outlets via a referral form from a statutory or voluntary organisation such as Doctors, Health Visitors, Citizens Advice Bureau, Welfare Office etc. All food given out by the Foodbank is donated often by Schools, Churches, Businesses, Individuals or through Supermarket collections.'

If you want to donate food, there is a box in Church or contact John Best who will gladly collect.

<u>Second World War Memorial – Harry B Smith & Walter</u> <u>Flowith</u>

In August, Helen was contacted by a gentleman called Philip Smith who wanted to visit the Church. He told her that his family have a long history with this church. Both his grandfathers (John Smith and Arthur Flowith) were Church Trustees in 1936. His father (Harry Smith) was the scoutmaster and his mother, Mary was the cubmaster. Philip lived at 66 Crossgates Lane from his birth until he was 15 and worshipped at this church, was a cub and a scout under the guidance of the Group Leader (John T Thompson) and he still has his Sunday school books inscribed with his name for good attendance!



This memorial on the Church wall is dedicated to the nine members of the congregation who died during the second world war. It says "To the Glory of God and in honoured memory of the men associated with this church who made the supreme sacrifice in the World War 1939 to 1945".

Philip is related to two of the men listed on the memorial plaque. Harry Bernard Smith was his father and Walter Flowith was his uncle. I would like to share with you some of the information that Philip has found about his father and uncle.

Harry Bernard Smith was born in Leeds on 6 January 1915, and was the only child of John and Annie Smith who worshipped here. The family moved to Cross Gates and Harry joined the 14th North East Leeds Scout Group here. He became the Scout Master in 1939. This is probably where he met his future wife, Mary Flowith, who was the cubmaster here from 1937.



Harry and Mary married at Cross Gates Methodist Church on 11 October 1941. As well as family members, you can see some of the scouts and cubs on this photo. Harry joined the Royal Airforce Volunteer Reserve. After officer training he joined 103 squadron at Elsham Wolds, near Brigg in May 1942 and subsequently flew Wellington, Halifax and Lancaster bombers on night raids over Europe. Harry was home on leave when his son, Philip was born in October 1942, and he was also home for his son's christening on the 16th December 1942. This was Harry's last day of a 6 day leave and he was killed the following night.



On 17 December 1942 Bomber Command planned an operation to lay mines in the sea of Nyborg Harbour in East Denmark. The bomber was shot down over Denmark and the mine load in the Lancaster exploded. The "Smith-crew" didn't have a chance, they were all killed. They were all buried in Aabenra Cemetery in Denmark.

Walter Flowith



This picture, taken in 1942, is of Walter Flowith with his brother-in-law, Harry Smith. Walter was born in 1923, his parents were Arthur and Mary Flowith who lived at 18 Austhorpe Road. Walter was a member of the Young People's group of Cross Gates Methodist Church.



Walter was a clerk before joining the navy in 1942 aged 18. In 1944 Able Seaman Walter Flowith was a wireless operator on HMS Janus in the Mediterranean near Italy. On 23 January 1944 HMS Janus was struck by a torpedo and sank off the Anzio beachhead. Of her crew only 80 survived, Walter Flowith did not survive. Walter Flowith was only 20 when he died and he is commemorated on the Portsmouth Naval Memorial

I would like to thank Philip Smith for enabling me to share the stories of these two young men with you.
