Same but different

When I wrote my piece for last month's newsletter, I had no idea that by the time I was writing this one we'd have gone through a period of a national mourning, and have a King instead of a Queen as our head of state. I knew the Prime Minister would have changed, though as August became September, we didn't know who it would be. Some of you reading this have experienced a King before, even if only as a child. But for most of the population, we have only ever known the Queen as our monarch. Will the difference to our lives be any more significant than remembering to sing "God save our King", and "send him victorious", along with new stamps and coins - eventually?

Despite the changes of Prime Minister and monarch, we live in the same world, facing the same challenges: the cost of living crisis, climate change, and the on-going impact of Covid, even if we no longer live with the restrictions of the previous couple of years. The world is the same, even if some things have changed. And we are the same people, worshipping the same God. Prime Minister and monarch will change, but God remains God; the King of kings is the same yesterday, today and forever. Circumstances may be different, our lives go through times of transition, but God is with us through it all. If you look back through what the Queen has said during her lifetime of speaking to the nation, and in particular her Christmas messages, you'll notice how often she spoke of her faith in God, and the importance of that faith as she faced all the challenges and changes that life brought her.

In 2002, the year of her Golden Jubilee, she said:

"I know just how much I rely on my own faith to guide me through the good times and the bad. Each day is a new beginning, I know that the only way to live my life is to try to do what is right, to take the long view, to give of my best in all that the day brings, and to put my trust in God."

May we each rely on our faith in God to guide us through good and bad, put our trust in God and give of our best, whatever is the same or different in the month ahead.

Leeds Sanctuary

Leeds Sanctuary will probably be better known to many of you by its former name of 'Leeds Methodist Mission'. For over 185 years the base for the Methodist Church in Leeds City Centre was Oxford Place Methodist Church. Following bold decisions taken by the Trustees in 2018 the Oxford Place Chapel closed. This decision enabled a new and exciting phase of Ministry in Leeds City Centre, now known as 'Leeds Sanctuary'.

It is a Christian Project for people of all faiths and none, run by the Yorkshire West Methodist District. It can be found at 43 The Calls in Leeds City Centre – and if you haven't been in that area recently, it is well worth a visit, the whole area has been upgraded and is unrecognisable from the scruffy, dark somewhat 'sleazy' area it used to be.

Leeds Sanctuary has 4 core values of 'Encounter, Justice, Sanctuary and Flourishing' they run events, courses and small groups on these themes as well as serving refreshments.

We have flyers in the Galilee at Church telling us some of what is happening in the coming weeks, why not go along and see, if nothing else you will be amazed at what has been done with 'The Calls' Love and prayers, *Barbara*.

The Repair Cafe

The Repair Café held at Cross Gates and initiated by Paul Coleman, opened its doors on the 17th September. A small army of volunteers including 'fixers' 'welcomers' 'hosts' arrived at about 9.30 am and set up their work stations and tools and welcomed people from the Cross Gates area who brought items to be repaired.

There was a generalized 'buzz' in the hall and I think many did indeed get their items fixed. Some were kindly told their item was irreparable! Karen Gray from Connecting Cross Gates brought several volunteers from her group who were a great help in the running of the group.

We hope the word will spread about the Repair Café at Cross Gates and it will go from strength to strength over the next few months. It will be on the 3rd Saturday of each month, 11 am to 3 pm. We will need volunteers from the church to man the kitchen serving refreshments.

History Corner

1921 – The Church's War Memorial Tablet was erected and a Commemoration Service held in the afternoon of Sunday 9th January 1921 when the Tablet was unveiled by Rev Owen Spencer Watkins CMG, CBE, Assistant Chaplain General Eastern Command.

1922 – The Post Office was transferred from Station Road to Church Lane.

1923 – Electric light was installed throughout the Church premises (by Thomas Rygby Ltd). Change was not always thought to be good however and disapproval was expressed by the Leaders' Meeting in this year about Sunday trading in the wooden hut on the village green.

A 'Sunshine Committee' was established in 1923 to provide flowers for the Church each week and afterwards arrange their distribution to sick members. A small card was printed to be sent with the flowers and the visiting ministers were asked to write the text for the service to be sent to the sick person with the flowers.

1924 – In September the tram service was extended from Seacroft Hospital to Cross Gates Police Station and in the following year the National Provincial Bank opened at the corner of Austhorpe Road and Station Road.
