We don't know each other very well yet, or perhaps at all, but I thought I'd start my first newsletter contribution by saying that I'm very much looking forward to meeting you, and I'm thrilled to now be Minister in Colton and Cross Gates as well as continuing in Garforth and Scholes.

More and more I suspect that church-going, following Jesus, and the words I and others who try to live lives of faith use are like some mysterious language. Really, I don't need people to try to understand why some of us gather on a Sunday morning, or study the Bible, or pray. But I do hope that the signs of my journeying with God are enough to help others to see the outrageous and amazing love of God.

Perhaps all we ever need to do is make time to share our stories and listen to those of others, rather than trying to explain 'who God is' in complicated ways and words.

The bible is quite straightforward on this really: God is love, and those who live in love live in God, and God lives in them. Not too strange and mysterious after all, I hope! *Becki*

Connexional Funds

There are several funds held at connexional level. Here we have highlighted three:

The Methodist Church Fund is the general fund of the Church and receives donations and legacies that are used in a variety of ways to support the Church in responding to Our Calling.

The Mission in Britain Fund exists to support work in the furtherance of the Church's mission. It does this principally by helping to fund God For All, the Church's Evangelism and Growth strategy and in particular the new places for new people work and the development and embedding of a Methodist way of Life; helping all of us live out Our Calling. In addition, the fund supports expenditure on Methodist Action on Poverty and Justice; Heritage; Justice, Dignity & Solidarity, and the Church's commitment to achieving net zero carbon by 2030.

The World Mission Fund promotes and encourages Methodist mission overseas. It does this through developing relationships of mutual help and enrichment with partner churches in other countries. It supports education and advocacy work and helps local Methodist partners respond to emergency situations in contextually appropriate ways. It also helps us to learn from our partners by providing opportunities like twinning and visits.

As promised in July 2022, Dorothy has continued her story...... I didn't want to go back to banking but needed to do something entirely different. In those days the place to look for work was Friday's Yorkshire Evening Post. One advert caught my eye – it said 'are you interested in history?' I thought 'in for a penny, in for a pound' so I applied, got an interview and got the job.

It was to work as a guide in the state rooms at Harewood House. We had to familiarise ourselves with the history of the house so that we could answer any questions the public might put to us. I really enjoyed the job and we had some good times. I did it for a year or two and later the Head Gardener, knowing I loved gardening and plants asked me if I would like to manage a plant centre they were about to open. I jumped at the chance – and it turned out to be the best job I ever had. The Head Gardener at the time was Alan Mason who had a gardening programme on YTV once a week. So I did that job for some time before retiring.
