Changes

September is the start of the Methodist year; it is a time of change for many churches including Crossgates. Rev. Helen White left our Circuit on 31st July and Rev. Becki Stennett becomes our new minister on 1st September, so Tracy asked me to write the introduction for this Newsletter. Her request arrived the day after the Circuit leaving service for Helen and Deacon Liesl Warren, it was an excellent service so I thought that I would tell you something about it.

Helen enjoyed singing with Concordia whenever she could, so had asked Concordia to lead the music for the service. The Circuit staff and stewards took part and the preacher was our Chair of District, Rev. Kerry Tankard. Kerry began his sermon by saying "I am an unapologetic fan of Star Trek – but only the series and films with the original cast!" He compared the film 'Star Trek VI: The Undiscovered Country' to the Bible reading and the current situation. In Exodus (14:5-14) the Israelites are leaving Egypt, but when they reach the Red Sea they think they are trapped and feel that the past seems more attractive, even after God has saved them. "As a Circuit you may not want changes, but are here today as a product of change, about to enter an Undiscovered Country." "Helen and Liesl are about to enter undiscovered countries of their own, the places that God has called them to be."

Both Helen and Liesl had been asked to choose a hymn that was important to them. Liesl had chosen the hymn "You're calling us and so we are gathered here" StF 37. She spoke about how she appreciated the positivity she had found in the circuit, allowing her to be a Deacon at the margins and seeing God there. This hymn affirms God's continued call to us and our willingness to continue to say yes - "Call the lonely, call the broken, young and old will sing hosannas. Let's fill this house with praise."

Helen said she had chosen a hymn that was particular to her time in Leeds. One of the things she had found here was the importance of working as a team, with Churches and Staff. Preparing worship together she had discovered "Down the mountain the river flows" (StF 377), - it linked her sabbatical theme of rivers, with the walking in the mountains that she already enjoyed. The line "The river of God sets our feet adancing" reminded her of Kath leading us dancing round the church, and doing the hokey-cokey at church socials. She finished by saying that she will look back with joy and tears, but most of all with thankfulness for God's refreshing river found in unexpected, as well as expected places.

We wish Helen all the best for the future and look forward to welcoming Becki as our new minister.

Message from our Senior Steward

Hello Everyone,

I hope you are all having a good summer and the wet weather has not disrupted your plans. Many of you will have heard I am moving house soon, so it has been quite a hectic time for Michael and I. I will still be coming to Cross Gates Church; I couldn't bear to leave it. Hopefully it will all happen in the next couple of weeks, although I don't think anything is certain in the house moving situation until it actually happens!

The Methodist Church is strongly committed to supporting survivors of abuse of any kind and especially abuse that occurred within a Church context. The 'Past Cases Review' challenged the Church to provide better care and support for survivors and the Church took steps to engage with a small group of survivors that now is a recognised advisory group with close links to the Connexional Safeguarding Committee. Out of this, 'Reflect and Respond' evolved, a four-week study guide. These sessions are to be held at Cross Gates. The first session is the 6th September, 7 pm to 9 pm in the Wesley Room. Please see the flyers up on Church noticeboards which give more information and dates. All are welcome to attend these sessions.

Our Church numbers are gradually increasing after covid. We are averaging 45 to 55 worshippers a week and some of those are new folk. Our Junior Church numbers remain low, but constant - nearly always 2 and sometimes 4. Lynda, Jane and Keith do an amazing job with them and there is always a lovely atmosphere in the Wesley room when they have finished their session.

For Harvest, (24th September) the children from Junior Church, Tots and Guests and the Uniformed organisations are decorating the Galilee as they did last year. We do need help to decorate the windowsills and Church though, so any offers of help gratefully received. We plan to use the hymn 'All things Bright and Beautiful' for our theme for the decorations. Ladies Group have offered to do 2 of the windowsills using the verse 'Mountains and Rivers' Any other offers to choose other verses for other windows? Andy Birkett is taking the service and it is going to be All Age Worship. Hopefully some of the Guides, Brownies and Rainbows will be coming.

If you receive worship at home material and no longer require it, please let me know. My number remains the same wherever I will be living!

Harvest Service on Sunday 24th September

We are asking for donations for the **Harvest Service** of suitable foods for the food bank that our Church has supported so willingly and generously over the years. You can bring your donations to Church any time over the coming weeks. There will also be a collection of money for the food bank so that extra items which are in particularly short supply can be purchased. It is likely to be a particularly challenging year for many, with more people needing the help the food bank provides.

Communities Standing for Change

Earlier this year the Trussell Trust launched 'Guarantee our Essentials', a new campaign in partnerships with the Joseph Rowntree Foundation. The Trussell Trust food banks provided almost 3 million emergency food parcels during the year ending March 2023. This includes almost a million for children.

It's a record high figure, overtaking the peak reached during the pandemic. It's heart breaking that so many people, including over 750,000 people who had to turn to a food bank for the first time, are unable to afford the essentials in one of the richest economies of the world.

Polly Jones, Head of Scotland at the Trussell Trust said 'The social security system is broken. No one could cover the cost of essentials from Universal Credit. There's never been any rationale in the system that links what you get with what things cost.'

That is why, in February, the Trussell Trust launched a UK campaign; Guarantee our Essentials. It calls on the UK Government to enshrine in law that, at a minimum, Universal Credit should protect people from going without essentials.

The Trust has costed up a 'basket of essentials' and found that the minimum rate needs to be at least £120 a week for a single adult – compared to the current £85.

The aim is to get commitments in political party manifestos, ahead of the general election. The Trust asks people to join them in calling for action and says: 'If we can ensure Universal Credit is linked to the cost of essentials, it takes us a long way towards ending the need for food banks.'

Our thanks go to John Best who facilitates our Church congregation to support the local food bank.

Proceeds will be shared between Church and a Charity (to be agreed at the Church Council)






more paddle boarding gear... I'll see what tempts me in Go Outdoors or Blacks.
